

**Call for Posters**  
**AAVPT Pharmacology Teaching Workshop**  
**for Veterinary Medical Education**

June 11-12, 2012

Texas A&M University College of Veterinary Medicine, College Station, Texas

The submission of abstracts related to the teaching and learning of veterinary pharmacology is invited for poster presentations at the AAVPT Pharmacology Teaching Workshop for Veterinary Medical Education being held June 11-12, 2012, in College Station, Texas. In addition to posters reporting on pedagogical research, posters are welcome which present topics in the areas of pedagogical strategies, outcomes assessment, development of teaching objectives, problem-based learning, the teaching of evidence-based decision making and critical thinking, and other topics related to the teaching and learning of veterinary pharmacology. For example, descriptions of specific methods of achieving teaching and learning objectives, such as classroom approaches, laboratory exercises, computer simulations, or other novel teaching ideas, whether in use or in development, are welcome.

**Guidelines for abstract submission:**

Abstracts must be submitted by 5:00 p.m., March 1<sup>st</sup>, 2012 to Sarah Wagner ([Sarah.Wagner@ndsu.edu](mailto:Sarah.Wagner@ndsu.edu)).

Abstracts must be submitted as a single document that is compatible with Microsoft Word® (any version for Windows). File names should be in the following format:

AAVPTTeachAbstract<space>first initial<space>surname<space>abbreviated title

Example: AAVPTTeachAbstract C Smith Fluid Ther Learning Outcomes

Abstract length is limited to 250 words, not including the abstract title and author information. The presenting Author's name must be underlined. Authors should include up to five key words. At least one author of the poster must agree to be present at the Workshop. Abstracts not conforming to these guidelines will be returned to the author for correction before consideration for presentation at the Symposium.

If references are required, they must be listed at the end of the abstract in the following format:       1. Short C et al. BiochemPharmacol 1969; 18(4):945-7

Abstracts will be reviewed by members of the symposium planning committee for appropriateness for presentation as a poster at the symposium, and invitations to present posters will be extended by April 1<sup>st</sup>, 2012. Abstracts of accepted posters will be included in written symposium proceedings and may be made available on the IVIS website (<http://www.ivis.org/proceedings/AAVPT/toc.asp>) or the AAVPT website.
